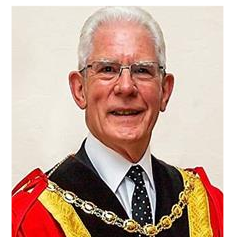
You should all be so proud to support your communities and because of this EOLP shall be awarding your hard work with the Compassionate Community Award.
