# Pancreatic Cancer UK

Useful information <u>booklet</u> available for carers, family and friends who are looking after someone with pancreatic cancer. Also available <u>Pancreatic cancer and end of life care: Information for people in the last few months, weeks or days of life for people with pancreatic cancer, their family, friends and carers who want to know more about what may happen in the last few months of life.</u>

Compassion in Dying is a national charity that helps people prepare for the end of life: how to talk about it, plan for it, and record their wishes. They do this through our free information line, publications and web resources, and through our work with diverse communities. The latest publication Planning ahead: My treatment and care aims to support people to discuss and record their wishes so they can get on with living life, knowing they have prepared for the future. It has been officially endorsed by the Royal College of Nursing and is featured on the website of the Royal College of General Practitioners and you can read about the launch here.

In 2017 <u>Alzheimer's Society</u> undertook an evaluation of the impact of the Research Network by interviewing and surveying researchers and people affected by dementia about their involvement. Our findings clearly establish that involving people affected by dementia has benefits across all types of research and across four themes:

- Impact on volunteers
- Impact on researchers
- Impact on research
- Impact on Alzheimer's Society

They now have evidence that backs up the belief that PPI is not only the 'right thing to do' but where done effectively gives a number of benefits. Find out more about PPI, the Research Network and how they can support you and your research.
