North West Model for Life Limiting Conditions

The 2015 North West End of Life Model has been reviewed, consulted and ratified by the North West Leads. The new model is the North West Model for Life Limiting Conditions, which can be found HERE *Please amend links in any local documentation to the new version*

The Model:

Supports the assessment and personalised care and support planning for patients with life limiting conditions, and those important to them ❖ 5 key phases from recognition of life limiting condition through to bereavement

The Good Practice Guide:

- Outlines core principles that cover each phase
- Guidance on key areas of care within each phase

Oldham NHS group recognised by the Royal College of Nursing Oldham Times 25/06/2021

The Northern Care Alliance NHS Group, which runs hospitals including The Royal Oldham Hospital, has been recognised by the Royal College of Nursing (RCN) for its efforts in ensuring nobody died alone during the Covid-19 pandemic. The Cygnet Team has been shortlisted in this year's nursing awards in addition to health visitor Emma Carey who works across Heywood, Middleton and Rochdale as part of the Rochdale Care Organisation.

'Instant access' to healthcare for residents in more than 100 Lancashire care homes Lancashire Post 10/06/2021

A large number of "avoidable" hospital admissions have been prevented after care home residents from across Preston and Chorley were given access to a new Digital Health system. Lancashire Teaching Hospitals has become the first NHS Trust in the UK to partner with Tameside and Glossop Integrated Care NHS Foundation Trust, which pioneered the system four years ago. Digital Health works by providing care homes with tablet computers and equipment to monitor key patient observations such as blood pressure, temperature, heart rate and oxygen level.

Education

Cruse Bereavement Care Suicide Bereavement Training in partnership with Health Education England, Public Health England, the Greater Manchester Health and Social Care Partnership and Healthier Lancashire and South Cumbria ICS.

The training will be delivered as a modular programme running over 3 months, starting in October 2021 and its aim is to support staff and volunteers working as bereavement counsellors and talking therapists, to be better equipped and able to support clients who have been bereaved by suicide.

The training is free of charge however, places are strictly limited to 45. Applications for this course can be made until 7th July 2021.
