Tony worked closely with the clinical networks and was a great ambassador for quality end of life care. He contributed hugely to network projects, most recently co-producing the Carer Check-In training module. He was North West champion for the Dying Matters campaign and a trustee for St. Catherine's Hospice for many years. Tony's passion for palliative and end of life care came from the saddest of circumstances - his son, Neil, died at the age of 35 after being diagnosed with a sarcoma.

Handbook for ICB Statutory Guidance for ICSs – Now available on FutureNHS

The <u>handbook</u> has been developed to supplement the earlier published Statutory Guidance for ICSs. It aims to provide practical advice on implementing quality palliative and end of life care for the whole population. The handbook is aimed at ICB commissioners responsible for planning and developing services but may also be beneficial to place-based commissioners, providers of PEoLC and the voluntary and community sector.
