People experiencing Homelessness - Draft Toolkit

NHS England commissioned Pathway, in association with UCL and Marie Curie to develop a new draft resource to enable commissioners and providers to work collaboratively with homeless inclusion services to identify need and gain feedback about the palliative and end of life care of people experiencing homelessness. With four questionnaires and detailed guidance on how to use them, this draft toolkit should prove an invaluable resource to help local areas develop and improve PEOLC for people experiencing homelessness.

Dementia Palliative Care Service Toolkit – Derbyshire Dementia Palliative Care Team

The Derbyshire Dementia Palliative Care Team have worked with regional NHS England to create a 'Gold Standard Model' and Toolkit that demonstrates improved palliative and end-of-life care for people living and dying with dementia. Research

Hospice at home can enable people to have a good death in the place of their choosing – National Institute for Health and Care Research

Hospice at home provides end-of-life care for people who would like to die at home. A review in England found that these services support a good death (as reported by the bereaved carer) and enable most people to die in their preferred location (usually at home). The researchers suggest that services could often be improved by better integrating them within local health services, reviewing their statutory funding arrangements, and making greater use of volunteers. Bereaved carers expressed a need for support from the staff they had come to know (instead of from someone new). [Read more here.](#)

National End of Life Care Intelligence Network – Updates from Office for Health Improvement and Disparities

The [place of death](#) factsheets have been updated to include data up to February 2023 for ICBs. This update changes the geographic focus from CCG to ICB.

The recent trends of deaths in [care homes](#) and provision of care factsheet, has been updated to include data up to February 2023, for England and local authorities.

[Place of death indicators](#) (hospital home, care home, hospice, and other places), have been updated with data for integrated care boards (ICBs) and ICB sub-location. This replaces data for CCGs and Sustainability and Transformation Partnerships.

The percentage of deaths in care homes who were [temporary care home residents indicator](#) has been updated with data for integrated care boards (ICBs) and ICB sub-locations. This replaces data for CCGs and Sustainability and Transformation Partnerships.
