#### NHS 2023 GP Patient Survey results published – Lancashire & South Cumbria ICB

This year, approximately 2.6 million people, aged 16 or over and registered with a GP practice in England, were invited to take part in the survey from January to April. The survey covers experience of primary care – primarily in general practice and monitors a range of experiences including ease of making appointments, whether or not a time for an appointment was allocated, opening hours, treatment and care planning by healthcare professionals. #### Palliative Care for People with Heart Failure – Research development event

The Palliative Care Research Network (North West Coast) PalCaRe NWC are setting up a series of <u>topic based groups</u> to facilitate developing research ideas, protocols and grant applications in specific topic areas. At the moment the three groups being set up will focus on developing research in heart failure, paediatric palliative care, and education. The first topic based group will focus on heart failure, facilitated by Dr Amy Gadoud at 10am on 18th September.

#### Electronic Palliative Care Coordination System (EPaCCS) Survey – Share2Care/EOLP

Shared electronic records such as EPaCCS contain key patient palliative and end of life information, including advance care planning and significant conversations. The End of Life Partnership (EOLP) and the Cheshire and Merseyside ICB Shared Care Records Team (Share2Care) have pulled together a short survey to obtain a deeper appreciation of the benefits that the sharing of Electronic Palliative Care Coordination Systems (EPaCCS) information is having for patient care. Findings from this survey will be used within communications, education as well as informing future commissioning priorities around the use of EPaCCS. This survey will take no more than five minutes (closes 28th September 2023).
